1.0 Fatima College of Health Sciences – Overview

Introduction

Established in 2006, Fatima College of Health Sciences (FCHS) aims to meet the United Arab Emirates growing need for skilled health care professionals. The college started by offering Bachelor of Science (BSc) Degree in Nursing in 2006 and has, since then expanded to offer academic programs at BSc level in Pharmacy, Physiotherapy, Radiography & Medical Imaging, Emergency Health (Paramedics), as well as Psychology. FCHS has four campuses located in UAE: Abu Dhabi, Al Ain, Al Dhafra and Ajman. FCHS is progressing towards international accreditation and to offer Postgraduate Diploma and Master Degrees in specialized Health Science programs. In addition to the Bachelor Degree, the college offers a Nursing BSc bridging program for diploma-holding practitioner nurses. The FCHS programs are designed to graduate students in health sciences disciplines in the UAE in line with UAE 2021 and Abu Dhabi 2030 Visions.

Since its establishment in 2006, FCHS has offered a Bachelor's degree in Nursing. Thereafter, expanded to offer five undergraduate degree programs at Bachelor's and Higher Diploma levels in Health Sciences.


Moreover, the Nursing department offers a BSc bridging program for diploma-holding practitioner nurses. The program was designed to graduate students in the Nursing field and to upgrade the education of the diploma holder nurses already in the health sector. The College is mandated to enhance the health sector workforce in UAE to satisfy the needs for well-educated and trained professional healthcare workers.

The demand on Paramedics, Pharmacists, Radiographers, Physiotherapists and Psychologists are also vital in UAE's health sector in order to provide the highest quality of healthcare to patients. Therefore, FCHS took the necessary steps and started four programs in Health Sciences (Pharmacy, Physiotherapy, Radiography & Medical Imaging, and Emergency Health). The first intake of Health Sciences students was in 2011 when students entered the Common First Year. Based on the UAE's current and future healthcare demands, Bachelor of Science in Psychology was introduced and is now offered in FCHS for the academic year 2019/2020. In 2019, all FCHS academic programs have obtained substantive change approvals from the Ministry of Education in order to contextualize and enhance all curriculums. FCHS graduates shall meet the UAE's healthcare needs and effectively work in a variety of settings with diverse patients, families and communities. Moreover, graduates will also be prepared to be employed in supervisory, managerial and educational positions.

FCHS provides innovative programs and the opportunity to work with high quality academics from within the college and/or abroad through collaboration with partner universities. FCHS provides an excellent educational environment and services to the students. Students will have access to all FCHS staff including the Director, administrators, counsellors, facilitators, lecturers and senior academic faculty. The college looks forward to supporting students throughout their time at FCHS.

Campus Locations

FCHS has four campuses within the United Arab Emirates: Abu Dhabi, Al Ain, Ajman and Al Dhafra. Currently FCHS offers most undergraduate degrees primarily in the Abu Dhabi and Al Ain campuses.



Since 2015, FCHS opened a campus in Rabat, Morocco, which offers the Bachelor's degree in nursing (bridging program).



Governance

Fatima College of Health Sciences (FCHS) is an educational entity administered by the Institute of Applied Technology (IAT), established in 2006 with a vision aiming to be the provider of excellence in health sciences education in the United Arab Emirates. IAT was founded in 2005 through Royal decree of His Highness (HH) Sheikh Khalifa bin Zayed Al Nahyan, President of the United Arab Emirates and Ruler of the Emirate of Abu Dhabi as a corporate body with full financial and administrative independence.




Figure 1 Overall Enrollment by Program




Figure 2 Abu Dhabi Campus Enrolment by Program




Figure 3 Al Ain Campus Enrolment by Program




Figure 4 Ajman Campus Enrolment by Program




Figure 5 Al Dhafra Campus Enrolment by Program




Figure 6 Rabat Campus Enrolment by Program




Figure 7 Bachelor of Science in Nursing Enrolment per year across FCHS campuses




Figure 8 Nursing Bridging per year across FCHS campuses




Figure 9 Bachelor of Emergency Health (Paramedics) enrolment by year across FCHS campuses




Figure 10 Bachelor of Pharmacy enrolment by year across FCHS campuses




Figure 2 Bachelor of Physiotherapy enrolment by year across FCHS campuses




Figure 12 Bachelor of Medical Imaging enrolment by year across FCHS campuses




Figure 13 Bachelor of Science in Psychology enrolment by year across FCHS campuses




Figure 3. Total Expat vs local Bachelor of Science in Nursing Graduates for academic year 2019-20 across FCHS campuses.




Figure 15 Total Expat vs local Bachelor of Emergency Health (Paramedics) Graduates for academic year 2019-20 across FCHS campuses.




Figure 16 Total Expat vs local Bachelor of Pharmacy for academic year 2019-20 across FCHS campuses.




Figure 4 Total Expat vs local Higher Diploma in Pharmacy for academic year 2019-20 across FCHS campuses.




Figure 18 Total Expat vs local Bachelor of Physiotherapy for academic year 2019-20 across FCHS campuses.




Figure 19 Total Expat vs local Higher Diploma in Physiotherapy for academic year 2019-20 across FCHS campuses.




Figure 20 Total Expat vs local Bachelor of Medical Imaging for academic year 2019-20 across FCHS campuses.




Figure 21 Number of Faculty by Program at Fatima College of Health Sciences




Figure 22 Number of Faculty by Credentials at Fatima College of Health Sciences
